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## *Note*

Frank Dickinson worked on the final stages of his study of "The Changing Position of Philanthropy in the American Economy" while suffering from what proved to be a mortal illness. He managed, however, to complete a draft of a manuscript, and then to respond to some of the suggestions made by a staff reading committee. He was also able to look over the introduction to the study prepared by Solomon Fabricant.
