PREFACE

This paper was prepared at the National Bureau of Economic Research at the request of and with financial assistance provided by the National Center for Health Services Research and Development, U.S. Department of Health, Education, and Welfare.

Our principal objective is to gain a better understanding of the factors that determine expenditures for physicians' services in the United States. We attempt to do this through analyses of trends over time and of variations across states at a given point in time. The statistical decomposition of the time series was largely the work of Fuchs, while Kramer assumed primary responsibility for the econometric cross-section analysis. The complete paper, however, represents a collaborative effort for which both authors take full responsibility.

We are indebted to Barry Chiswick, Martin Feldstein, Michael Grossman, Anne Scitovsky, Christopher Sims, Finis Welch, Robert Willis, and three anonymous National Center reviewers for their constructive comments and suggestions.
