BRITISH ISLES

I. HISTORICAL TABLES

1. The shipping lists which form the basis of table I (Emigration from the Port of London in 1635) indicate the name and the age of the emigrant as well as the destination of each ship (Virginia, New England, St. Christopher and Barbados, Island of Providence, Summer Islands "Bermudas"). Our table has been compiled by adding the names in the shipping lists. The name Francis has been treated as that of a man, except where it was expressly stated that a woman was referred to.

2. Table II (England) is a summary of the weekly lists of emigrants established at the command of the Treasury by the Custom-House officers in the following ports of emigration: London, Liverpool, Dover, Southwood, Bristol, those going to Europe, to Ireland and to the Isle of Man not being included.

The weekly figures concerning these ports for the year 1774 begin with December 11, 1773, and go on to December 26, 1774, but the following weeks are missing: April 12 to 19, April 26 to May 3, May 3 to 10. 51 weeks are given.

The figures for the year 1775 begin with December 26, 1774, and go on to December 31, 1775. The only week missing is November 6 to 13. 52 weeks are given.

The figures for the year 1776 begin on December 31, 1775, and go on to April 7, 1776.

As regards sex, all convicts have been classed as males. Practically all persons under "sex not stated" are children whose names are not given.

The large number whose ages are not stated usually includes those sailing to other ports of Europe. In the latter case information does not seem to have been exacted. The entry is sometimes found "These all refused further information" or "were obstinate and refused any information." There are also occasionally large numbers of convicts whose ages are not given.

3. Table III concerns emigration from Scotland to North America and Virginia during 1774-1775. The lists are established on the same principle as those underlying table II. They were drawn up on the basis of a letter of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury of December 8, 1773, which was addressed to the Commissioners of Customs for account of Persons Emigrating from Scotland to America, etc. (U. S. at Public Record Office, London, T 17, 20, p. 478). However these lists do not include passengers to the continent of Europe.

The lists of emigrants are written on loose sheets of paper, following no time order. Below are the dates for which lists are to be found in the Record Office:

1774: February 3 to 10, May 2, May 7, May 13 to 20, May 16, May 18, August 12 to 18, August 19 to 25, September 8 to 15, Sep-

tember 30 to October 7, October 7 to 14, October 17 to 23, November 14, December 2.

1775: March 30, April 7 to 14, April 28, May 1, May 9, May 26, May 31, June 9 to 16, July 7 to 14, July 13, July 14 to 21, July 28, September 3, September 4.

2 lists are undated.

Where the sex is "not stated," we are dealing mainly with children whose names are not furnished in the lists. Where the age of the children was not shown, we have placed them in the column headed "under 14."

There is not the same variety of *trades* as amongst the English emigrants. Most of the Scotch are farmers or weavers. The number of merchants is extremely small. The lists render it probable that the passengers were genuine emigrants in search of employment who took with them their wives and children. Usually the reasons given for their emigrating are the high rents and the general poverty of their country. It is sometimes stated that they are without means of subsistence in their own country. Where no occupation or employment is indicated, the statement is sometimes found that the passengers were generally of the labouring class or that "only five were people of any consequence".

II. STATISTICS OF INTERCONTINENTAL PASSENGERS

1. *Methods Employed and Competent Authorities*

The statistical reports to the Treasury regarding emigration appear to have been suspended during the period of the American Revolution. Whether these reports were resumed after that War, we have been unable to ascertain. In the Archives which we searched we could find neither passenger lists nor other statistical material dating before 1815. The regular emigration or passenger statistics start with that year. Like the earlier statistics, they are based on returns compiled by Custom-House officers and their staffs in the several ports. The data for these returns have been obtained from the masters of British vessels in pursuance of the Act of June 24, 1803, "for regulating the vessels carrying passengers from the United Kingdom to His Majesty's plantations and settlements abroad, or to foreign parts, with respect to the number of such passengers".

This first "Emigration Act" provided that British ships sailing overseas may, on pain of certain penalties, only carry one person for every two tons and foreign ships only one person for every five tons. Moreover, the Custom-House officers were instructed to ascertain, on the basis of the passenger lists delivered by the masters of vessels, whether the number of persons shipped was within the prescribed limit. These lists were preserved by the Customs authorities who issued the clearance papers.

From that period onward the materials for the tables relating to the movement of passengers between the United Kingdom and extra-European countries have been drawn from the returns furnished by masters of vessels leaving the ports of the United Kingdom for, or ar-

riving at such ports from, places out of Europe and not within the Mediterranean Sea.

The Act of July 5, 1825, extended the protection accorded to emigrants on foreign vessels, although notable exceptions were made for British vessels, as in the case of those proceeding from Ireland to British North America. In the course of the following years this legal protection was steadily extended to diverse other types of vessels. The improvement dates most especially from the amended Passenger Act of 1842 (5 and 6 Victoria, ch. 63), and was carried further in the Acts of 1849, 1852, 1853, 1855, 1863, 1870, 1889, 1894.

The Customs authorities were charged at first with the administration of the Passenger Acts. Special inspectors were not appointed, perhaps because, prior to the age of steamboats, emigration went through a multitude of ports. On the basis of the material furnished by the Customs authorities, the Colonial Department published the first statistical reports on the movement of passengers.¹ The financial assistance of emigrants and all questions relating to their settlement in the Colonies were entrusted in 1837 to an Agent General for Emigration and to a Board of Colonisation (South Australian) Commissioners, and three years later the Office of the Colonial Land and Emigration Commissioners was established. These Commissioners, from the time of their second annual report in 1841, for thirty years published passenger (emigration) statistics, adding frequently new particulars and making further improvements, but always in accordance with the actual state of the legislation dealing with the protection of emigrants.

All powers and duties conferred and imposed on them by the Passenger Acts of 1855 and 1863 were transferred to the Board of Trade by the Merchant Shipping Act of 1872, and the information available in respect of the passenger movement from 1815 onward was incorporated in their report entitled *Emigration from the United Kingdom, 1873*. From that date, annual reports were published by the Board of Trade up to 1913. For the later publications of the Board, see our references.

Mr. A. W. Flux, head of the Statistical Department of the Board of Trade, responding to our request for additional information, kindly forwarded us on February 4, 1927, a full memorandum on British migration statistics. This has enabled us to check our study regarding the bases of the migration figures at various periods, from 1841 onward. The same authority had previously favoured us with ten statistical tables covering the period 1815-1924. For that reason the Board of Trade is quoted as authority even in cases where the same figures had previously been found in printed publications.

2. Definitions.

The primary object of the Passenger Act was, not to find a suitable basis for emigration statistics, but rather to afford protection to a certain category of passengers.

The statistics relate to all intercontinental passengers, and not exclusively to persons intending to reside overseas. These passengers are officially divided into cabin and steerage passengers; but neither the two combined nor the steerage passengers alone cover the groups of emigrants proper. Nevertheless, until 1860 one would not be far wrong in treating all passengers, even the few cabin passengers, as persons who sailed for overseas countries with a view to changing their abode.

To identify the number of passengers, minus those paying for cabins, or the number of steerage passengers with the number of emigrants would be a doubtful procedure. Originally, these distinctions were made not for statistical purposes but for administrative ends and were adapted to the regulations then in force. Their object was to discriminate between emigrants for whose benefit a supervision of the ship's accommodation was maintained, and other passengers. A comparison of third class passengers, a new category since 1908 on British vessels, with steerage passengers is not practicable, because the two classes are not coextensive.

Before 1863 the masters only of such vessels as carried steerage passengers were required to furnish passenger lists to the Customs authorities. By reason of the voluntary nature of information from masters of ships carrying only cabin passengers more of them were recorded in some years than in others. During the period 1842 to 1852 travellers in vessels not governed by the Passenger Acts were generally entered in the column "cabin passengers". From 1853 to 1863, travellers whose age and sex were not distinguished, as in the case of infants, were entered in a separate column, the remark being made in some years (1853 and 1854) that they consisted mainly of cabin passengers. The figures for cabin passengers fluctuate remarkably from year to year, and one cannot tell for which years they are complete.

After 1863 the statistics comprised all classes of outward passengers, but the Emigration Commissioners do not seem to have published the number of cabin passengers separately in their annual reports until after 1876, nor is the information available in any official source.

After 1860 a new and graver source of error crept into the passenger statistics. With traffic improvements, and lower fares, especially through the introduction of steamships, the ratio of general travellers to emigrants rose. This was particularly true of cabin passengers as compared to other classes.

That disadvantage, however, was balanced in part by clearer definitions beginning with 1853, which permitted a division of passengers into aliens and citizens. German authorities estimated at 2,000 the number of aliens who sailed from British ports in 1844, and the number of these rapidly increased from 1847 onward. Thus in 1853, when aliens were distinguished from citizens for the first time, the British statistics record 31,459 alien passengers, and 20,349 whose nationality was not ascertained, but most of whom were aliens. For decades this class of passenger of unknown nationality was considerable: at the commencement of the sixties, over 20,000; later, under 10,000; and only since 1908 has it disappeared. Even to-day the particular nationality of alien passengers is not recorded.

3. *Immigration.*

The arrival of extra-European passengers has been recorded since 1854, although masters of vessels were not required by law to supply lists of such passengers. These statistics, however, for the years before 1870 are incomplete and otherwise defective. (See explanatory notes Nos. 11-14). After that date the master of every vessel who brought steerage passengers to the United Kingdom from places out of Europe was required to deliver a list at the port of arrival, and from these lists tables of immigration were compiled. Moreover, masters of vessels arriving from places out of Europe and carrying passengers other than steerage often furnished information about such passengers although it was not required.

In these circumstances, a comparison between the number of citizens departing and the number arriving furnishes the most reliable statistical measure of emigration. Although for the period 1870 to 1876 the number of immigrant citizens cannot be separately indicated, we may compare the inward and outward movement of migrants by supposing that the proportion of aliens among the immigrants was not large.

4. *Demographical Particulars.*

The regulations concerning the registration of *age* and *sex* were as follows. Prior to 1856 those aged 14 and over were regarded for the purposes of the Passenger Act as adults. From 1853 to 1876, infants under 12 months (males and females from 1861 onward) were distinguished from children 1 to 12 years old. After 1856 and until 1908, all persons of 12 years of age and upwards were considered as adults.

After April 1, 1912, the ages of "emigrants" and "immigrants" were grouped as follows: under 12, 12 to 17, 18 to 30, 31 to 45, 46 years and over, 'age not stated'. Males and females were distinguished.

During the period 1854-1902 the adult outward British and Irish passengers were classified—according to the information supplied by the Board of Trade—by occupation into a number of groups varying from 39 to 53 for males and from 6 to 8 for females.¹ Similar particulars were shown for the years 1877 to 1902 about passengers classified as "foreigners" and "nationality not distinguished".

The countries of arrival or departure have been grouped usually as follows: British North America, Australia and New Zealand, United States, and "all other places". However, in the above-quoted official printed reports we found annual figures for the West Indies and South Africa (table IVa); detailed particulars referring to emigration to the Australian Colonies (table IVc); as well as statistics concerning emigration to British North America during the period 1842-75 (table IVc). Detailed tables of the outward movement will be found in the annual reports (1841-1902) relating to the East Indies, British West Indies,

Cape of Good Hope and Natal (including from 1841 all passengers, the British being distinguished after 1877), Central and South America, and "all other places". "Cape of Good Hope and Natal" was given separately for inward passengers, and British were distinguished after 1882. After 1894 "all other places" was divided into India (including Ceylon), other British Colonies, and other foreign countries (for both outward and inward passengers). After 1904 Natal was distinguished from the Cape of Good Hope and after 1906 New Zealand from Australia.

III. STATISTICS OF INTERCONTINENTAL MIGRANTS

As passenger statistics had ceased to represent the movement of migrants, particulars about the past and future residence of passengers were published from April 1, 1912. By this means it became possible to separate migrants from other passengers. Passengers stating that they were changing their residence from or to the United Kingdom were classed as emigrants or immigrants respectively.

IV. PASSENGERS TO AND FROM THE CONTINENT OF EUROPE

Statistics of passengers travelling between the United Kingdom and the Continent were based on returns voluntarily furnished to the Board of Trade by the shipping companies, etc. Accordingly, the statistics for the years up to and including 1907 are less complete than those which have been furnished since 1908. (Tables XXVII and XXIX.) These figures do not include travellers by air.

Besides the voluntary returns mentioned above, lists of alien passengers were required to be furnished to the Customs authorities (under Act 6 Will. IV, ch. II) by the masters of certain vessels arriving with aliens on board. These lists, which contained the names and descriptions of aliens, were summarised for the years 1890-1905. (Table XXVIII.) The Aliens Act, 1905, transferred the duties relating to alien passengers to the Home Office and statistics of the alien passenger movement since 1906 have been published in the Annual Reports of the Inspector under the Aliens Act. This Act was superseded by the Aliens Restriction Acts, 1914 and 1919. These statistics (Table XXX) date from 1921, classify aliens by nationality and include persons travelling by air between the United Kingdom and the continent of Europe.

Alien wage earners, equipped with a permit from the Ministry of Labour, may be counted among immigrants proper and can be also classified separately.

V. TRANSIT

We have included in tables IV and XII all alien passengers who embark in the British Isles for an overseas destination or who arrive from overseas. The overwhelming majority of these should be regarded as transmigrants. However, it is only since 1921 that "transmigrants" and "persons in transit," in the strict sense of the word, have been recorded

in the statistics compiled by the Home Office in connection with the Aliens Act.

Table XXXI refers to alien transmigrants as defined in Article 4 (1) of the Aliens Order, *i.e.*, migrants in transit for whom shipping companies give a guarantee that they will leave British territory as quickly as possible. Figures relating to arrivals (table V of the source) and departures (table VI of the source) of transmigrants show that the guarantee is honoured. To these transmigrants it has been necessary to add the aliens who are given in table II of the source under the heading "in transit". This heading refers to aliens admitted to the country as aliens in transit on their own responsibility. The figures given under this heading have here been divided between outgoing and returning migrants in transit in the same proportion as the outgoing and returning transmigrants. "Transmigrants" and "aliens in transit" are classified in our source according to nationality.

Statistics about migration into and out from the British Isles supplementing the figures in the British national tables will be found in other sections of the present volume. Statistics about the number of migrants from the British Isles or their divisions to Canada (1829-80 and 1900-24), Australia or colonies later combined into that Commonwealth (1851-1924), New Zealand (1853-1919), Argentina (1857-1924), Brazil (1861-1924), Cuba (1902-24), United States (1820-1924), Mexico (1909-24), and Hungary (1879-1924), will be found in the national tables for those countries. Statistics about the number of migrants returning to the British Isles from the Cape of Good Hope (1900-12), Natal (1911-12), Australia or colonies later combined into that Commonwealth (1851-1919), New Zealand (1853-1919), Argentina (1857-1924), United States (1908-24), Mexico (1911-24) and Uruguay (1879-1921) will be found in the national tables for those countries.
