



Funding Available for Health Economics Research

The Becker Friedman Institute's new health economics research initiative is accepting applications for predoctoral fellowships and research grants for postdoctoral scholars. These fellowships are meant to encourage original inquiry that will deepen our understanding of health and health care markets and how they relate to the overall economy.

Fellows awarded funding will conduct and collaborate in research on the economics of health and health care and interact with a large network of other economics scholars at the institute and throughout the University of Chicago.

Awardees from organizations other than The University of Chicago will be based at their home institution but will likely visit The Becker Friedman Institute during the course of the grant period.

Pre-Doctoral Fellowships

The program will offer dissertation fellowships for PhD students in the amount of \$25,000 per yearly fellowship.

Post-Doctoral Research Grants

Research grants of \$25,000 each will be awarded to researchers who have completed their PhD less than five years ago.

We welcome applications from students and researchers at institutions both within and outside the US.

Applications are due by March 15, 2016; awards will be announced April 15, 2016.
