Financial support for this program is provided by the National Institute on Aging and the National Bureau of Economic Research. Appointees must be US citizens or lawfully admitted for *permanent* residence.

*Fellowship awards are contingent on funding from NIA.

We offer support for outstanding economists to visit NBER's Cambridge office for one or two years of intensive research in the areas of aging and health. Visiting fellows are free of all teaching and other university responsibilities.

NBER's Fellowship Program in Aging Research supports promising economists at an early stage in their research careers. Fellows develop their research expertise in the economics of aging and health in an environment of prominent senior scholars and leaders in the field.

Applications are being accepted for the 2012-2013 and/or the 2013-2014* academic years. Applicants must have completed a PhD before they begin the program, and must be US Citizens or *permanent* residents.

Fellows typically receive a yearly stipend of \$60,000 to \$74,000 depending on years of experience and available funds, as well as office space, use of computer facilities at the Bureau's Cambridge office, and a budget for research expenses.

- Curriculum vitae
- Publication list
- Names of at least two references
- Summary of research plans (*not to exceed 1,000 words*)
NOTE: If requesting two years, include explanation in this summary.
