To encourage research in the economics of aging and health, NBER, with funding from the National Institute on Aging, offers support to outstanding economists to visit our Cambridge office for a year of intensive research.

NBER's Fellowship Program in Aging and Health Research supports promising economists at an early stage in their research careers. Fellows develop their research expertise in the economics of aging and health in an environment of prominent senior scholars and leaders in the field.

The one-year stipend is \$65,000 to \$90,000 depending on years of experience and available funds, along with office space, use of computer facilities at our Cambridge office, and a small budget for travel and research expenses.

Eligibility

Applications are being accepted for the 2017-18 and/or 2018-19* academic years. Applicants must have completed a PhD before they begin the program, and must be US Citizens or *permanent* residents.

Application Materials Required

- ◆ Curriculum vitae and publication list
- ◆ Names of at least two references
- ◆ Research proposal (up to 3 pages of text, 2 of pages of tables/graphs, plus references)

NOTE: If requesting two years, include explanation in the proposal.
