To encourage research that will deepen our understanding of the health, labor supply, behavioral, and other economic or policy implications of retirement and/or disability, the NBER Retirement and Disability Research Center, with funding from the Social Security Administration, seeks applications from doctoral students in economics for 1 year fellowships.

Fellows will be selected based on reviewers' assessment of the strength of their proposed research and potential to make an important policy-relevant contribution to our understanding of retirement and/or disability.

The fellowship offers a 12-month stipend of \$24,816 and covers tuition at the fellow's home institution (up to \$16,000) plus health insurance and limited funds for research expenses and travel. A working paper or progress report on the funded topic must be submitted by September 2021, and will be a critical component of renewal applications.

Eligibility

Applicants must

- be enrolled as a full-time PhD student at a North American college or university;
- address a topic directly relevant to disability policy; *and*
- be recommended by their dissertation supervisor.

NBER strongly encourages applications from women, minorities, people with disabilities, and veterans.

NOTE: NBER is not able to sponsor a visa for this fellowship.

- Research proposal (up to 3 pages of text and 2 of pages tables and graphs), 1 page of references
