## Addendum to the 2010 User Guide for the Natality Public Use File

## Introduction

This document serves as an addendum to the User Guide to the 2010 Natality Public Use File and presents general background information, data quality issues, and documentation tables for new data items exclusive to the 2003 U.S. Standard Certificate of Live Birth that have not been previously released. These items are: educational attainment of father, birth interval, receipt of WIC, time of birth, source of payment, mother's body mass index (BMI), mother's height, mother's pre-pregnancy weight, mother's weight at delivery, cigarette smoking before and during pregnancy, infertility treatment, maternal infections, maternal morbidity, 10-minute Apgar score, and infant breastfed. ## Demographic characteristics

## Educational attainment

Father--Information on educational attainment of the father is available for the revised reporting area, representing 76.4 percent of all U.S. births in 2010. See the 2011 User Guide for a detailed definition of Father's education and instructions for data collection, editing and computation. Information on education of father is often missing on birth certificates of children born to unmarried mothers, greatly inflating the number in the "Not stated" category. While the overall percentage of "not stated" records was 15.8 percent for the reporting area (Table I), two areas (Delaware and the District of Columbia) had more than 30 percent of records with missing data for this item.

## Birth interval

Information on birth interval is available for the revised reporting area, representing 76.4 percent of all U.S. births in 2010. See the 2011 User Guide for a detailed definition of birth interval and instructions for data collection, editing and computation. The percent of records for which birth interval is not stated is shown in Table I. See Documentation Table 12 for 2010 data.

## Medical and Public Services Utilization

## Did mother get WIC food for herself during this pregnancy?

Information on receipt of WIC food for the mother during this pregnancy is available for the revised reporting area, representing 76.4 percent of all U.S. births in 2010. See the 2011 User Guide for a detailed definition of the WIC program and instructions for data collection, editing and computation. See Documentation Table 13 for 2010 data. The percent of records for which WIC receipt is not stated is shown in Table I.

## Time of birth

Information on time of birth is available for the revised reporting area, representing 76.4 percent of all U.S. births in 2010. See the 2011 User Guide for a detailed definition of time of birth and instructions for data collection, editing and computation. A recode of these data grouped into 6-hour time intervals is shown in Documentation Table 14. The percent of records for which time of birth is not stated is shown in Table I.

## Source of payment for the delivery

Information on the principal source of payment for the delivery is available for the revised reporting area, representing 76.4 percent of all U.S. births in 2010. Data for the following categories are available for all revised reporting areas (see Figure 1 of the 2011 User Guide):

- Private insurance
- Medicaid
- Self-pay
- Other (Specify)

In addition, more detailed information for the "other" category is available for 25 states, representing 48.2 percent of all U.S. births in 2010. For these states, the "other" category is further delineated into the following groups:

- Indian Health Service
- CHAMPUS/TRICARE
- Other government
- Other

See the 2011 User Guide for a detailed definition of source of payment and instructions for data collection, editing and computation. The percent of records for which source of payment for the delivery were not stated is shown in Table I. See Documentation Table 15 for 2010 data. A report on 2010 data on source of payment is forthcoming.

## Maternal Lifestyle and Health Characteristics

## Mother's body mass index (BMI)

BMI provides an indication of the mother's body fat based on her height and prepregnancy weight (see below), and is available for the revised reporting area, representing 76.4 percent of all U.S. births in 2010. See the 2011 User Guide for a detailed definition of BMI and instructions for calculation, editing and computation. See Documentation Table 16 for 2010 data. The percent of records for which BMI is not stated is shown in Table I.

## Mother's height

Information on the mother's height (in feet/inches) is available for the revised reporting area, representing 76.4 percent of all U.S. births in 2010. See the 2011 User Guide for instructions for data collection, editing and computation. Mother's height is one of the measurements used to compute mother's BMI (see above). The percent of not stated records for mother's height is shown in Table I.

## Mother's pre-pregnancy weight

Information on the mother's pre-pregnancy weight (in pounds) is available for the revised reporting area, representing 76.4 percent of all U.S. births in 2010. See the 2011 User Guide for instructions for data collection, editing and computation. Mother's pre-pregnancy weight is one of the measurements used to compute mother's pre-pregnancy BMI (see above). Mother's prepregnancy weight, along with mother's weight at delivery (see below), is used to compute the mother's weight gain during delivery (see 2011 User Guide). The percent of not stated records
for mother's pre-pregnancy weight is shown in Table I.

## Mother's weight at delivery

Information on the mother's weight at delivery (in pounds) is available for the revised reporting area, representing 76.4 percent of all U.S. births in 2010. See the 2011 User Guide for instructions for data collection, editing and computation. The percent of not stated records for mother's weight at delivery is shown in Table I.

## Cigarette smoking before and during pregnancy

Information on smoking before and during pregnancy is available for the revised reporting area except for Florida, Georgia, and Michigan, representing 64.8 percent of all U.S. births in 2010. Information on cigarette smoking before and during pregnancy is reported on the revised 2003 certificate (see Figure 1 of the 2011 User Guide) for:

- Three months before pregnancy
- First three months of pregnancy
- Second three months of pregnancy
- Third trimester of pregnancy

See the 2011 User Guide for detailed definitions and instructions for data collection, editing and computation.

See Documentation Table 17 for 2010 data on cigarette smoking before and during pregnancy. This table also contains information on quitting smoking before and during pregnancy. The percent of records for which cigarette smoking before and during pregnancy were not stated is shown in Table I.

## Risk factors in this pregnancy

Information on each pregnancy risk factor, except Eclampsia, is available for the total revised reporting area, representing 76.4 percent of all U.S. births in 2010. Nine risk factors are separately identified on the revised 2003 certificate in a checkbox format (see Figure $\mathbf{1}$ of the 2011 User Guide).

Pregnancy resulted from infertility treatment -Data for this risk factor have not
previously been published. There is a general checkbox question about whether the pregnancy resulted from infertility treatment. If the answer is "yes" (box checked) then the infertility treatments are grouped into two separate categories:

- Fertility enhancing drugs, artificial insemination, or intrauterine insemination
- Assisted reproductive technology (e.g. in vitro fertilization (IVF), gamete intrafallopian transfer (GIFT))

A subset of the revised state reporting area - 23 states and the District of Columbia, representing 56.0 percent of 2010 births - reported information on the type of infertility treatment used. See the 2011 User Guide for detailed definitions and instructions for calculation, editing and computation. See Documentation Table 18 for 2010 data. The percent of records for which the general checkbox question about whether the pregnancy resulted from infertility treatment is not stated is shown in Table I.

## Infections present and/or treated during this pregnancy

Five infections are separately identified on the revised 2003 certificate in a checkbox format (see Figure 1 of the 2011 User Guide):

- Gonorrhea
- Syphilis
- Chlamydia
- Hepatitis B
- Hepatitis C

Information on infections present and/or treated during this pregnancy is available for the full revised reporting area, representing 76.4 percent of all U.S. births in 2010, for all items but Syphilis, which is not reported by Colorado. See the 2011 User Guide for detailed definitions and instructions for data collection, editing and computation. See Documentation Table 19 for 2010 data. The percent of records for which infections present and/or treated during this pregnancy is not stated is shown in Table I.

## Maternal morbidity

The following six morbidities are separately identified on the revised certificate in a checkbox format (see Figure 1 of the 2011 User Guide):

- Maternal transfusion
- Third or fourth degree perineal laceration
- Ruptured uterus
- Unplanned hysterectomy
- Admission to intensive care unit
- Unplanned operating room procedure

Information on maternal morbidities is available for the full revised reporting area, representing 76.4 percent of all U.S. births in 2010, for all items but third or fourth degree perineal laceration, which is flagged as "not reported" for Delaware and Maryland. See the 2011 User Guide for detailed definitions and instructions for calculation, editing and computation. See Documentation Table 20 for 2010 data. The percent of records for which maternal morbidity items were not stated is shown in Table I.

## Infant Health Characteristics

## Apgar score

10-minute score--The 10-minute score is available for the revised reporting area, representing 76.4 percent of U.S. births in 2010. Control totals are as follows: 10-minute Apgar score was collected for 1.2 percent $(35,525)$ of births in the reporting area in 2010; an additional 1.1 percent $(34,426)$ of births in the reporting area had "not stated" 10 -minute Apgar score for infants whose 5-minute score was less than 6. See the 2011 User Guide for a detailed definition of 10-minte Apgar score and instructions for calculation, editing and computation.

## Infant breastfed

Information on whether the infant was being breastfed during the period from birth to discharge from the hospital is available for the revised reporting area except California and Delaware, representing 63.4 percent of all U.S. births in 2010. See the 2011 User Guide for a detailed definition of infant breastfed and instructions for calculation, editing and computation.

See Documentation Table 13 for 2010 data. The percent of records for which infant breastfed at discharge are not stated is shown in Table I.

## Quality of Data

State-specific data quality issues of particular concern for 2010—For the data items below, they should either be used with caution or their reporting flags are set to "not reporting" for certain states in the public use file:

Delaware:

- Mother's pre-pregnancy weight/Mother's weight at delivery- Data for these items and the derived weight gain item for this state should be used with caution.
- Multiple data items - the following data items for Delaware should be used with caution. These items have been excluded from Documentation Tables 13 and 20.
- Maternal morbidity - Perineal laceration
- Is the infant being breastfed at discharge?


## District of Columbia

- Several data items (date of last live birth, trial of labor, and infant breastfed) have high not stated values and should be used with caution. See Table I.

Georgia:

- All tobacco use items - Reliable data on tobacco use were not available for Georgia for 2010. Data for these items for this state should be used with caution and have been excluded from Documentation Table 17.

Maryland:

- Unplanned operation - The level of unplanned operation may be inflated due to inaccurate reporting. Data for this item for this state should be used with caution.
- Perineal laceration - Reliable data for this item were not available for Maryland for 2010.

Data for these items for this state should be used with caution and have been excluded from Documentation Table 20.

New Mexico:

- Principle source of payment - This item for New Mexico has a high not stated value, 27.2 percent, and these data should be used with caution. See Table I.

Nevada:

- Principle source of payment - This item for Nevada has a high not stated value, 23.1
percent, and these data should be used with caution. See Table I.
