

Kjersten Bunker Whittington is a doctoral candidate in the Department of Sociology at Stanford University. Her interests are in the intersection of science, the scientific labor market, and social stratification. Kjersten's dissertation investigates how gender disparities in scientific productivity vary across employment sectors and work settings. She pays particular attention to the dissemination outcomes of patenting and other forms of commercial activity. Kjersten also studies formal organizations and the science economy. With collaborators, she is engaged in a project that examines the contingent role of inter-organizational networks and regional clustering in influencing innovative output among science-based firms.

Her dissertation titled, "Employment Sectors as Opportunity Structures: The Effects of Location on Male and Female Dissemination" is currently supported by a dissertation fellowship from the Science and Engineering Workforce Project at the National Bureau of Economic Research.
